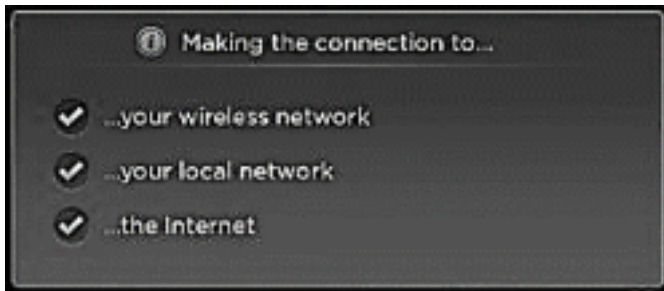

Wireless Connection Setup

- Press  on your remote to open the main screen
- Scroll down and select Settings
- Press the right arrow button and select Network
- Press the right arrow button and select Wireless
- Your TCL Roku TV will start scanning for available wireless network Scroll down and select your wireless network name from the list
- Press the  button
- If your network is password-protected, use the on-screen keyboard to enter your wireless network password.
- Scroll down and highlight Connect then press the  button
- After you submit your network password, the TV will display progress messages verifying your connection as shown below.

WARNING

Under Missouri law, a private campground owner or an employee or officer of a private campground owner is not liable for an injury to or the death of a person or any property damage resulting from the inherent risks of camping under the Revised Statutes of Missouri.

As used in this section, the following terms mean:

“Camping”, all aspects of visiting, staying at, using, and leaving a private campground, including lodging of all types;

“Inherent risks of camping”, those dangers, hazards, or conditions that are an integral part of camping including, but not limited to, the following:

1. Features of the natural world, such as trees, tree stumps, naturally occurring infectious agents, roots, brush, rocks, mud, sand, standing and moving water, and soil;
2. Uneven and unpredictable terrain;
3. Natural bodies of water and accessories permitting the use of natural bodies of water, including piers, docks, swimming and aquatic sports, or recreation facilities or areas;
4. A lack of lighting, including lighting at campsites;
5. Campfires contained in or outside a fire pit or an enclosure provided by the private campground, bonfires, grass or brush fires, wildfires, and forest fires;
6. Weather and weather-related events;
7. Insects, birds, and other wildlife;
8. Animals of other campers or visitors that cause injury, unless the private campground owner or an employee or officer of the private campground owner has accepted responsibility for care of the animal;
9. A violation of safety rules or a disregard for signs or other methods of communicating warnings;
10. Another camper or visitor at the private campground acting in a negligent manner, if the private campground owner or an employee or officer of the private campground owner is not involved;
11. Actions by a camper or visitor that exceed his or her physical limitations or abilities;
12. Actions by a camper or visitor involving climbing, rappelling, caving, mountaineering, or any other related activity;
13. Damage caused by fireworks from a camper, visitor, or offsite entity not authorized by the private campground owner or employee or officer of a private campground owner; and
14. Any person coming onto the campsite not reported to the private campground owner or an employee or officer of the private campground owner; “Private campground”, any parcel or tract of land, including buildings and other structures, that is owned or operated by a private property owner where five or more campsites are made available for use as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use. The term “private campground” shall also include recreational vehicle parks.

CAVES

Onondaga Cave State Park ◦ (573) 245-6576

Descend into the depths of Onondaga Cave State Park and drop into a world of wonder: towering stalagmites, dripping stalactites, and active flowstones help make the cave a National Natural Landmark and illustrate why Missouri is often called “The Cave State.” Visitors can take guided tours into the underground wonderland. Tours will start April 1st and be offered seven days a week through October 31st.

Fisher Cave is truly one of the park’s most spectacular natural wonders. Naturalist-led tours provide an interesting adventure for park visitors. From the low, narrow streamside passages to the huge rooms filled with calcite deposits, Fisher Cave offers one outstanding cave scene after another. Inside these rooms and passages are well-preserved bear claw marks, cave wildlife and a vast array of calcite deposits ranging from intricate helictites to massive columns 30 feet tall.

Guided tours along well-lighted walkways are conducted by trained rangers departing every 20-30 minutes starting at 9:00 am. The Cavern Tour takes one hour and twenty minutes to complete, covering 1 ¼ mile round trip along well-lighted walkways. On the tour, you will see both the rarest and largest cave formations in the world. Unfortunately, strollers are not permitted. Learn how the ancient Wine Table (World’s rarest cave structure) was formed completely under water. The entire cave complex stretches upwards past the height of a 7-story building and extraordinary formations can be seen throughout. Meramec Caverns is the largest commercial cave in the state of Missouri.

In 1864 the Confederates chased the Union soldiers across the Huzzah River near Steelville, to Leasburg, where the Union soldiers planned on escaping by train. However, Confederate troops burned train tracks in the nearby towns of Bourbon and Cuba, thus trapping the soldiers in Leasburg. You can find the Battle of Leasburg Historical Marker across from Fulton Park in Leasburg, Missouri.

Guided Gigging Trips

What Is Gigging?

Gigging refers to spearing fish rather than catching them with a hook and line. It is primarily a nighttime activity and is most effective in shallow, clear water. Fish harvested by gigging are known generally as “suckers.” They are caught with a spear because traditional angling methods are not effective for catching these species. Giggers usually stand at the bow of a flat-bottomed boat outfitted with a bright light and a rail to lean upon. They hold their fork-tipped spears over the surface of the rushing water, scanning for fish. Once they spot a sucker, they try to gig it with their spears. It sounds straightforward, but it is challenging. The boat is moving, daylight is gone, it’s cold outside, and the fish are quick. Gigging takes practice and patience.

Gigging Season on Ozark streams and rivers runs from Sept. 15 through Jan. 31.

The daily limit is 20 fish per person.

Game fish cannot be harvested by gigging. When gigging, identify fish clearly before you spear them so that no game fish are taken illegally.

You are permitted to gig the following:

- Bowfin
 - Bowfin must remain whole and intact while on state waters or adjacent banks.
- Buffalo (bigmouth, black, smallmouth)
- Bullhead (black, brown, yellow)
- Carp (black, bighead, common, grass, silver)
 - Bighead carp, common carp, grass carp, and silver carp may be possessed in any number and do not count in the daily limit.
- Carpsucker & quillback (highfin, river, quillback)
- Freshwater drum
- Gar (alligator, longnose, shortnose, spotted)
- Suckers (northern hog, redhorse, white)
- Sunfish (bluegill, green, longear, redear).

Do people really eat suckers?

Cooking and eating suckers is just as enjoyable as gigging them. Cleaning a sucker requires scaling the fish, filleting off the meat, and scoring the filet. The filet is then breaded and deep-fried. A sucker filet has bones within the meat, however scoring and frying the meat dissolves the bones and makes for a delicious meal.

Rates

- Guided gigging trip for 1-2 people for up to 5 hours \$250
- Each additional person \$100
- Fish fry on the gravel bar \$100
 - On a cool night there is nothing more enjoyable than pulling the boat to the bank, cleaning fish and having a fish fry right there on the river bank. The fish are cleaned and scored, then are battered in cornmeal and deep fried using a cast iron pot and cooking oil. To complete the meal we will provide fried potatoes, hushpuppies, onions and ice cold bottled water.

Do I need a permit?

In Missouri, you'll need a permit to fish in the state unless you qualify for an exemption. Residents of Missouri 65 years old and older are not required to purchase a fishing license. Anglers 15 years old and younger are not required to purchase a license regardless of residency.

What should I bring on the trip?

We provide all gear you will need on the boat including life jackets and gigs. Should you wish to bring your own equipment you are welcome to do so. Per Missouri state law Children under the age of seven are required to wear a life jacket anytime they are on a boat. You are welcome to bring any food or non-alcoholic drinks you would like to enjoy while gigging. Even on a hot summer day being on the rivers at night can become very chilly, therefore it is recommended to bring a jacket and gloves with you. In the winter months there is likely to be snow and ice on the water, therefore it is highly recommended to bring a coat, coveralls, and waterproof boots and waterproof gloves.

Can I keep the fish?

You are welcome to take home any fish we gig. If you plan on keeping fish please bring a cooler with ice so you can take your fish home. The guides will be able to assist you with cleaning your fish. If you prefer not to keep the harvested fish, they will be donated to locals who enjoy eating them.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can we swim in the lake? – Absolutely! There are turtles and fish, but they are the same species as you would encounter if you swim in our local rivers, so you don't need to worry about them! Please remember, there is not a lifeguard on duty, so you do **swim at your own risk**.

What should we do with our trash? – Please tie your bags up and set them at the end of your parking area between 8:00 am and 9:00 am. One of our staff will be happy to dispose of it for you.

What time are “quiet hours”? – From 11:00 pm until 7:00 am all voices, noise and music should not be audible outside your reserved area.

Can we build a “campfire”? – Fires are allowed only in fire rings provided at each Tiny House or RV site. Exercise caution with fires and extinguish before departing.

Can we bring our own firewood? – The state of Missouri has several federal and state quarantines on forest pests such as gypsy moth, Asian longhorned beetle, imported fire ant, and thousand cankers disease. As a result, it is illegal to bring untreated firewood into Missouri from most out-of-state sources. Firewood originating from Clark, Scotland, Lewis, Marion, Adair, and Macon counties is prohibited from being moved to other areas within Missouri. Authorities in Missouri highly encourage the public to always buy, cut, or collect firewood as near as possible to where you will burn it (within 10 miles is best).

Can we use the pavilion? – As long as it hasn't been reserved for a private event. There are cornhole boards, washer boxes, a volleyball for the volleyball court, picnic tables, bbq grills and a large fire pit at the pavilion that you also have access to. When you are finished please put the items back where you found them. There are also 2 restrooms located at the right side of the pavilion.

Can we use the kitchen in the pavilion? – Only if you have reserved the pavilion for a private event.

What time can we check in? – You can check in any time after 3:00 pm.

What time do we have to check out? – You must check out before 11:00 am.

How many vehicles can we bring? – There is room for one RV, one truck with a camper or trailer or two passenger vehicles at each RV site, truck with a trailer or two passenger vehicles at each Tiny House, or one vehicle near each Treehouse or A Framet. If you have extra vehicles, please park them in the parking area at the office or pavilion. Vehicles are prohibited from parking in the grass and must stay on the gravel parking pads.

Can we fish in the lake? – Yes! There are crappie, perch, and catfish in the lake. You can either release fish immediately back into the lake or clean them for dinner.

Can we shoot off fireworks? – No. We do not allow fireworks.

Can we bring our pet? – Tiny House Adventures Resort is pet friendly.

- **Additional Lodging Rules** – You are permitted to bring your housebroken pets for an additional pet fee of \$25.00 per pet, per stay. Please do not leave your pets unattended inside any building. If damages occur due to your pet you will be held responsible. While outside we request that you keep your pet on a leash and clean up after them. No one wants to step in doggie pool!

- Service animals that have been properly trained to assist with a specific task are excluded from the pet fee, but you must let us know in advance that you are bringing a service animal and what task has the animal been trained to perform. Please note that animals whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the ADA.
- Any reservation that is found to have pets not previously included on their reservation will be assessed a \$50.00 + tax fee, per pet. Tiny House Adventures Resort reserves the right to remove pets and their owners for inappropriate behaviors, especially if they disturb or endanger other guests.
- **Additional Primitive Camping & RV Site Rules** – While outside your RV we request that you keep your pet on a leash and clean up after them. No one wants to step in doggie poo!

Can we have visitors? – Visitors are permitted but must leave by 11:00 pm. If staying later than that they are considered an additional guest and you must pay for them to stay. You are responsible for the behavior and actions of all persons staying with or visiting you. In addition, you agree to indemnify and hold harmless Tiny House Adventures Resort, of and from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, damages and expenses, including but not limited to attorney's fees and court costs arising out of or in any way connected with or alleged to have risen out of use of the facilities.

Can we use the mess hall? – Access to the Mess Hall is included with all Treehouse and A Frame reservations. You may use the kitchen and both restrooms inside, just clean up after yourself when you are finished. Items in the refrigerator belong to the person that put them there, please be respectful. You may use the stove, sinks, plates, coffee cups, glasses, flatware, etc, however, all of the items must be thoroughly cleaned, dried, and put away when you are finished.

What if we are bringing extra people? – You will need to call us at (573) 259-6040 to add them to your reservation.

Can we bring our dirt bike, ATV, UTV, or golf cart? – Side by sides, UTVs, 4-wheelers, motorcycles, dirt bikes, and golf carts are welcome, but must abide by the same rules as all other vehicles and are prohibited from being in the grass.

What is your smoking policy? – All of our buildings are NON SMOKING. You are permitted to smoke outside the units, under the pergola, on the porch, etc., but the windows and doors must remain closed. If there is a smoke odor inside the unit the renter will be assessed a \$200.00 cleaning fee. If tobacco waste is found on the ground, you are responsible for removal. Ashtrays and trash cans are provided for appropriate disposal. If not removed a charge of \$100.00 per hour will be assessed for removal.

Is there somewhere nearby to buy firewood? – Just down the road, at 4075 Highway H, is a firewood stand. It is often left unattended, but there is an honesty box (and security camera) so please help yourself. If it happens to be empty don't worry, Pete will surely be there soon to fill it back up.
